## MOLEY SWEEPS WEEKLY AWARDS

After winning the 157 pound weight class at the PSAC championships in impressive fashion Matt Moley was named the EWL Wrestler of the Week on Dec. 7.

Moley pinned his way through the 67th annual Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Championships over the weekend. In his three bouts Moley racked up three first-period pins and was named the tournament's Outstanding Wrestler. This is the second time this season that Moley has been honored by the EWL as the Wrestler of the Week.

For the year Moley is now 8-1 with five pins. In his career the two-time All-American is 105-35 as he chases the school record for wins in a career which stands at 127.

## SCHMELYUN REACHES 100 CAREER WINS

When Rick Schmelyun posted a win by fall in just 30 seconds of his first match at the PSAC championships he became the 15th wrestler in school history to reach 100 career wins.

Schmelyun would go on to earn one more win at the PSAC championships and is now tied with Andy Fitzpatrick ('94) on the all-time win list with 101 victories.

He is the fourth wrestler in head coach John Stutzman's career to reach the milestone.

## GRAHAM REPEATS AT PSAC CHAMPIONSHIPS

Nate Graham, at 174 pounds, won his second straight PSAC championship last week. Graham won all four of his matches to earn the title. Among his wins were two victories by fall and two by decision. Graham was the only the only member of the Huskies to win a title in 2008.

The junior leads the Huskies this season in wins with 14 and is tied for third in pins with four.

## HEAD COACH JOHN STUTZMAN

John Stutzman begins his fifth season as head coach of the Bloomsburg University wrestling team in 2009-10.

Under his tutelage, he has produced 18 wrestlers who have qualified for the NCAA Division I Championships and produced an All-American in three consecutive years (the first time since 1985-89 that Bloomsburg has produced an All-American in at least three straight years), while recording 40 dual meet victories. He was named the 2007 EWL Coach of the Year, earned national recognition as a team, produced the 2007 EWL/PSAC Freshman of the Year as well as the 2009 EWL tournament's outstanding wrestler.

Prior to becoming Bloomsburg University's head wrestling coach, he was an assistant coach for seven years at the Division I level. During those seven seasons, Stutzman worked at three very successful universities: the University at Buffalo, Northern Illinois University and Bloomsburg. Throughout that time, he assisted in the development and maturation of six conference champions, 22 Division I NCAA qualifiers, and two Division I All-Americans. He has recruited six classes that have been ranked in the top 25 nationally.

In addition to his college coaching duties, Stutzman has coached with the New York Athletic Club at the 2004 and 2008 USA Olympic Freestyle Trials, as well as the 2006, 2007, and the 2009 World Team Trials. During this time, I coached five Three World Team Trials participants, Two Olympic Team Trials participants, and one USA National Team Member. He was also an assistant wrestling coach for the 2009 NWCA All-American tour in Seoul, South Korea. and was the assistant wrestling coach for Team USA for the University Team in Poland in 2009.

### OFF TO GOOD STARTS

Sophomore Jacob Dabashinsky and red-shirt freshman Josh Roosa are both off to good starts for the Huskies.

Dabashinsky is 12-7 on the season with a team-high six pins. He was won four straight matches and five of his last six. Dabashinsky was third at the PSAC championships.

Roosa is 10-4 on the season and has won six of his last eight matches. He finished second at the PSAC championships.

### CAREER BEST IN WINS FOR WALSH

Through the first month and half of the season heavyweight Zac Walsh has already set a personal-best mark in wins with nine.

After posting eight victories as a freshman, Walsh is 9-10 through the first month and a half of the season. He finished fourth at the PSAC championships and took home fifth at the Navy Classic.
