### Boro Concludes Regular Season against Pittsburgh, West Virginia with EWL Dual Meet Title on the Line

**EDINBORO, Pa.** – Edinboro concludes the 2009-10 dual match season this weekend with the Eastern Wrestling League regular season title on the line.

The Fighting Scots have been the pursued for a number of years, with three straight regular season crowns and seven in the last ten years.

In addition, the Fighting Scots own a 30-match non-losing streak in EWL competition, with a 28-0-2 record during that period. One of those two ties was a 19-19 stalemate at West Virginia a year ago.

The Fighting Scots begin the weekend with a showdown against Pittsburgh on Friday, February 19 in a match that in all likelihood will decide the EWL regular season title. The Panthers are 16-1-1, setting the school record for dual meet wins, and are ranked 18th in the latest NWCA/USA Today Division I Coaches Poll and 21st in the InterMat rankings. Pitt has not lost in the last 15 matches since dropping its only dual this year to Lehigh, 24-9, in November. The only other blemish is a 19-19 tie to Penn State. The Panthers have won ten straight duals since then.

The Panthers showcase a deep and talented lineup that has helped them go 5-0 in EWL action. A win over the Fighting Scots would give Pitt its first EWL regular season crown and snap Edinboro's six-year run as the champion.

Edinboro is 8-5 overall and 4-0 in the EWL. The Fighting Scots need to defeat Pittsburgh and then at least tie West Virginia to repeat as the EWL dual meet champion.

That match is followed by the annual grudge match against West Virginia on Saturday, February 20 at McComb Fieldhouse. It is Edinboro's last home dual, and the Fighting Scots will recognize nine seniors beforehand -- Chris Birchler, Joe Bockmore, Pat Bradshaw, Michael Bunn, Kyle Fluke, Jarrod King, Phil Moricone, Dan Snyder, and Joel Webster.

In a year where they've had to make numerous lineup changes, West Virginia brings a record of 2-9 into the match. The Mountaineers are 2-2 in EWL action and compete at Cleveland State on Friday night.

"We need to compete," exclaimed head coach Tim Flynn. "Pittsburgh is 16-1-1. They're good. It's real easy to get up for Pittsburgh and West Virginia. The dual meet crown is on the line."

Last week's loss to North Carolina left the Fighting Scots to 25th in both the the NWCA/USA Today Division I Coaches Poll and InterMat's Top 25.

The good news for Flynn is that while it took all year, he may finally have his anticipated lineup in place for the first time all year. The Fighting Scots have been ravaged by injuries all year. It appears that Jarrod King will return from an injury suffered during weightlifting to compete at 165 lbs., while Phil Moricone is expected to wrestle at 174 lbs.

King has missed the last three duals due to the injury. The defending national champion at 165 lbs., he is currently 29-1 and is ranked second by Amateur Wrestling News, third by InterMat and third by WIN Magazine. He is expected to renew his rivalry with WVU's Donnie Jones that dates back to high school. A year ago Jones came away with a 5-3 decision in the dual, but King won by fall in just 23 seconds to claim the EWL title.

King leads a contingent of five Boro wrestlers who appear in the various rankings. Eric Morrill is seventh according to Amateur Wrestling News and eighth in InterMat's and WIN Magazine's polls at 125 lbs. The junior has a 29-4 record. Chris Birchler comes in with a 28-9 record and is ranked 17th by WIN Magazine and 20th by InterMat at heavyweight. Torsten Gillespie (24-12) has moved up to 15th at 149 lbs., according to Amateur Wrestling News, while Pat Bradshaw is 18th at 184 lbs. according to WIN Magazine. He has a 25-11 record.

## Weight-by-Weight Matchups

### ►125 lbs. -- Eric Morrill (29-4, Jr.)

Eric Morrill continues to enjoy an outstanding season. The junior competed just once in the Virginia Duals due to a minor injury, but has since run off six wins in dual competition. Morrill has a 29-4 record and is ranked seventh by Amateur Wrestling News and eighth by InterMat. He picked up a fifth place finish at the Southern Scuffle, going 5-2. The weight class included the top five wrestlers in the country. He fell in the semifinals to Virginia's Ross Gitomer, 3-2, but came back to edge Gitomer, 3-1 in the second sudden victory session, to bring home fifth place. His other loss was to sixth-ranked Zach Sanders of Minnesota, 3-2, in the consolation semifinals. Prior to that Morrill was first at the Reno Tournament, defeating third-ranked Anthony Robles of Arizona State in the title match and Penn State's Brad Pataky, now 13th, in the semifinals. He also picked up a 10-4 decision over 15th-ranked Alan Bartelli of Boise State. He came away with the title at the PSAC Championships in December, and also has a first place finish at the Oklahoma Gold Classic and a second place at the EMU Open. Morrill was a national qualifier at 125 lbs. in 2008 and redshirted last year. He'll face a pair of talented freshmen in Pittsburgh's Anthony Zanetta and West Virginia's Shane Young. Zanetta has climbed into 20th in the latest InterMat rankings and has a 30-8 record. That leads the Panthers in wins. He is a former two-time PIAA state champion at Keystone Oaks High School. Young is also a former PIAA standout from Penn-Trafford, where he was a three-time WPIAL champion. He owns a 12-7 record, with four of those losses to nationally-ranked wrestlers.

### ►133 lbs. -- Kyle Fluke (12-9, Sr.)

Kyle Fluke had been out of the lineup since last November but made a triumphant return recently. He dominated his match against Bloomsburg's, Jason Guffey, the 125 lbs. PSAC champion, winning 13-2, then picked up a technical fall the next day against Cleveland State. He was not as successful against North Carolina, suffering a 9-6 loss, giving up four points in the waning moments. That left the senior with a 12-9 record with a fifth place finish at the EMU Open and a sixth place showing at the Oklahoma Gold Classic. Pittsburgh answers with Jimmy Conroy, a two-time national qualifier and two-time EWL champion. The senior is 14-8. On Saturday Fluke will face West Virginia's Colin Johnston, a sophomore with a 20-3 record. Johnston dropped down from 141 lbs., where he was the EWL

## Boro Wins Fifth Straight PSAC Championship December 5, 2009 at Edinboro

Edinboro finished with 142.5 points to edge second place Bloomsburg and claim its fifth straight PSAC Championship. The Huskies totaled 134.5 points, with Clarion third (110 points) and Lock Haven fourth (99.5 points). The Fighting Scots tied the record of five straight PSAC crowns previously set by Lock Haven from 1940-42 and 1947-48. Jarrod King (165 lbs.) and Pat Bradshaw (184 lbs.) led four Fighting Scots who won titles, as the duo each picked up a third PSAC crown. Eric Morrill (125 lbs.) and Chris Birchler (hwt.) also came away with first place finishes.

Edinboro has now won eight of the nine and 11 of the last 13 PSAC Championships.

runnerup a year ago. He is ranked 16th by Amateur Wrestling News and 18th by InterMat.

### ►141 lbs. -- Joel Webster (15-11, Sr.)

Joel Webster suffered an injury in the PSAC Championships and had not competed since then until the Virginia Duals. The senior showed he had a little rust to shake off, losing two of three matches, and in the three recent duals he has also lost two of three. He looked more like the wrestler who defeated defending national champion J Jagers of Ohio State a year ago vs. Bloomsburg and CSU. He won by technical fall and major decision, But the inconsistency reared its ugly head against North Carolina, as he suffered a loss by defensive pin with two seconds left in the second period. That left him with a 15-11 ledger. Webster placed

second at the PSAC Championships, but was injured at the finals. Webster also has a third place showing at the EMU Open and a sixth at the Oklahoma Gold Classic to his credit. He'll meet Pittsburgh's Tyler Nauman, the defending EWL champion, on Friday, followed by Ryan Romano, a sophomore with an 0-4 record, on Saturday. Nauman has a 29-3 record with nine falls and is ranked 10th by Amateur Wrestling News and 16th by InterMat. WVU has struggled at 141 lbs., using five different wrestlers in its dual matches. Ryan Romano, a sophomore with a 0-4 record, or freshman Anthony Curcio (4-8) are expected to fill the void.

### ►149 lbs. – Torsten Gillespie (24-12, Jr.)

After missing three straight dual matches following a concussion, Torsten Gillespie has returned to pick up three straight wins. The junior won twice by fall, including an upset over 19th-ranked Josh Roosa of Bloomsburg at 5:10. Gillespie was named the EWL Wrestler of the Week for his efforts. Against UNC he won a 6-0 decision over Jon Burns. That gave Gillespie a 24-12 record and boosted him into 15th place in the latest Amateur Wrestling News rankings. He turned in some of his best wrestling just prior to suffering the concussion at the Southern Scuffle, bringing home third place while going 6-1. He also has a second place finish at the EMU Open, a third place finish at the PSAC Championships, plus a fifth place at the Oklahoma Gold Classic and a sixth

place showing at the Reno Tournament. Gillespie is a two-time national qualifier, once at 141 lbs. and a year ago at 149 lbs. Pittsburgh will send out Eric Albright, a 2007 national qualifier at Virginia who is 16-14 with the Panthers. Mike Rowe, a senior who competed for three seasons at Nebraska, has taken over as the starter at WVU. He has an 8-6 record.

### ►157 lbs. – Johnny Greisheimer (21-18, Fr.)

The original plan was to redshirt Johnny Greisheimer after the freshman lost to fellow freshman Matt Laird in the wrestleoffs. But when Laird went down with a season-ending knee injury that plan was scrapped and Greisheimer was inserted into the the lineup. The two-time New York state champion had been busy wrestling in open tournaments, picking up a third place finish in the Ashland Open and the EMU Open's freshman/sophomore division. He lost both of his matches at the Reno Tournament, then went 2-2 at the Southern Scuffle. Greisheimer has struggled since joining the starting lineup, currently showing a 21-18 record. Three of his last four matches have been against nationally-ranked wrestlers, as he faced Hadley Harrison of Clarion followed by two-time All-American Matt Moley of Bloomsburg. UNC's top wrestler, tenth-ranked Thomas Scotton, edged Greisheimer thanks to riding time via a 4-3 decision. He catches a little bit of a break this weekend, meeting Pitt's Donnie Tasser and WVU's Kyle Eason. Tasser is a redshirt freshman with a 5-4 record. Eason is third-year sophomore who wins a 6-8 record.

### ►165 – Jarrod King (29-1, Sr.)

Jarrod King is expected to return after missing the last three duals with an injury. King comes in ranked second according to Amateur Wrestling News and third in InterMat's rankings. He owns a 29-1 record, boosting his career ledger to 115-26. The defending national champion, King tasted defeat for the first time at the Southern Scuffle when he lost to Bloomsburg's Rick Schmelyun in the semifinals. That came after King had won twice by technical fall, along with a 3-0 decision over 20th-ranked Stephen Burak of Penn, to reach the semifinals. King responded to the loss with a fall over Cornell's Justin Kerber, who is ranked 12th, and a 4-0 decision over 14th-ranked Paul Young of Indiana. That gave King third place. He has gone on to post eight straight wins. He repeated as the champion at the Reno Tournament with a 2-1 decision over eighth-ranked Dan Vallimont of Penn State in the finals. He also owns a decision over Clint Sponseller of Ohio State. He has also won titles in the EMU Open, Oklahoma Gold Classic and PSAC Championships. Pittsburgh will choose between Karl DeCiantis (7-13) and Adam Counterman (15-9). DeCiantis was second at the EWL Tournament at 174 lbs. last year. On

Saturday King and WVU's Donnie Jones renew a rivalry that goes back to their high school days. Jones was the last person to defeat King a year ago, handing the Boro senior a 5-3 loss in the dual match. King countered with a fall in 23 seconds in the EWL championship bout. Jones has a deceiving 17-9 record. Seven of his nine losses have been to nationally-ranked foes. Jones is a two-time national qualifier.

### ►174 lbs. – Phil Moricone (14-3, Gr.)

Phil Moricone has been in and out of the lineup since returning in late December. The sixth-year graduate student returned again against North Carolina, registering a major deci-

sion to improve to 14-3. The two-time national qualifier returned in December after missing over a year with a back injury and later a knee injury. He sat out the Virginia Duals after returning in the Reno Tournament and placing third. That was followed by an eighth place finish at the Southern Scuffle, as he medical forfeited his last two bouts. Pittsburgh's David Sullivan is a fifth-year senior who like Edinboro's Chris Birchler began his career at East Stroudsburg. Sullivan has a 20-10 record. West Virginia has had to use three different starters, with Matt Weston the likely opponent on Saturday. The sophomore has a 6-10 record with losses in six of his last seven bouts.

## ►184 lbs. -- Pat Bradshaw (25-11, Sr.)

Pat Bradshaw has been up and down this year after moving down to 184 lbs., but in recent bouts he looks like he's starting to get accustomed to the lower weight. That was evident in a solid 5-2 decision over UNC's Nick Tenpenny last weekend. He seeks his second trip to Nationals and currently has a 25-11 record. The senior has been in and out of the national rankings and is currently 18th in the WIN Magazine poll. He had a fifth place finish at the Reno Tournament, winning five of seven matches. Bradshaw earlier picked up his third straight championship at the PSAC Championships, and also placed third at the Oklahoma Gold Classic and fifth at the EMU Open. Bradshaw's match against Pitt's Zac Thomsusseit should be key on Friday.

Thomsusseit, a tough sophomore who finished as the EWL runnerup at 184 lbs. last year, has a 19-6 record with six falls. West Virginia is expected to send out sophomore Rob DeSano, who is 0-6, or Brandon Boyer, a senior who is 0-1.

## ►197 lbs. -- Shawn Fendone (13-8, Jr.)

Shawn Fendone has come on strong of late, improving to 13-8 despite a loss in his most recent match against North Carolina's Dennis Drury. He picked up his team-leading eighth fall of the season against Cleveland State. He recently upset former national qualifier Jimmy Hamel of Buffalo via a 9-2 decision, then pinned Alex Thomas of Clarion. The latter victory avenged a loss by fall to Thomas in the PSAC Championships 197 lb. title match. Fendone returned after missing the first month of the season due to injury to pick up a second place finish at the PSAC Championships. He got off to a fast start in Reno with wins in his first two matches, including an 11-6 upset of second-seeded Tyler Sorenson of South Dakota State, but he lost his next two matches. Fendone also went 2-2 at the Southern Scuffle, with both wins by fall. Pittsburgh's Matt Wilps has a 29-8 record and is ranked 17th by Amateur Wrestling News. West Virginia's Kyle Rooney is a former transfer from Heidelberg who was named the EWL Wrestler of the Week last week after upsetting Wilks and Erik Schuth of Ohio, both nationally ranked, a

week ago. Rooney is 9-10 but has won four straight matches.

## ►285 lbs. -- Chris Birchler (28-9, Sr.)

Chris Birchler has a 28-9 record and is ranked 20th by InterMat after transferring from East Stroudsburg. He has faced plenty of strong competition along the way. A year ago at Nationals Birchler fell one win shy of All-American status. He had his best showing of the season at the Southern Scuffle, bringing home third place. Birchler went 5-1 in North Carolina, reaching the semifinals with three straight wins. A 3-2 loss to third-ranked Nathan Everhart of Indiana sent him to the consolation round, where he claimed 3-2 decision over Gardner-Webb's Dustin Porter, to finish third. In addition to the showing at the Southern Scuffle and PSAC Championships, Birchler has also been second at the Oklahoma Gold Classic and fifth at the EMU Open. Birchler's tough season will continue this weekend when he faces Pitt's Ryan Tomei and WVU's Brandon Williamson. Tomei is 28-5 with 12 falls. He is ranked ninth by Amateur Wrestling News and 11th by InterMat. Williamson is a former two-time JUCO All-American who is 14-6, including a 2-1 win over Tomei a week ago.

## Head Coach Tim Flynn

► Now in his 13th season at the helm of the Fighting Scots, Tim Flynn has enjoyed incredible success. He has a 144-44-4 record in dual matches, setting the school record for career wins previously held by Fred Caro. More importantly, he has led Edinboro to 10 EWL Tournament championships in the last 11 years and 11 PSAC titles in 13 years. Edinboro has finished in the top ten at the NCAA Division I National Championships two of the last three years.

## ► Eight Fighting Scots Place in Edinboro Open

Edinboro held its annual Edinboro Open on Saturday, February 13, with eight Fighting Scots placing. **Shawn Giblin** led the way with a second place finish at 133 lbs., with **Kory Bissett** also coming in second at 149 lbs. **Chris Honeycutt** and **Tim Lutke** were third at 184 and 197 lbs., respectively. Edinboro also received fifth place finishes from **Ashton Osterberg** (133) and **Ernest James** (hwt.). **Michael Bunn** was sixth at 125 lbs., with **Dan Estricher** losing to James in the fifth place match at heavyweight to capture sixth place.

## ► Torsten Gillespie Named EWL Wrestler of the Week

**Torsten Gillespie** returned with a bang after missing three duals due to a concussion. With falls in both of his bouts against Bloomsburg and Cleveland State, The junior was recognized as the EWL Wrestler of the Week for the period ending February 7. Most impressive was a fall over 19th-ranked Josh Roosa of Bloomsburg at 5:10. That was followed by a pin of Cleveland State's Dan Castillo, with the end coming at 3:51.

## ► Fendone Named EWL Wrestler of the Week

Junior **Shawn Fendone** was recognized as the EWL Wrestler of the Week for the week ending January 17. He not only picked up a pair of big victories at 197 lbs., but in the process played a key role in comeback wins over Buffalo and Clarion. He gave the Fighting Scots a chance to complete a 9-17 rally over Buffalo with a 9-2 win against Jimmy Hamel, a 2009 national qualifier who had an 18-5 record. The next day he clinched Edinboro's 25-13 victory at Clarion with a fall over Alex Thomas at 2:36. That avenged a loss by fall to Thomas in the PSAC championship bout.

## ► Fighting Scots Seek to Continue 30-Match EWL Non-Losing Streak

Edinboro's 19-19 tie with West Virginia at the end of the 2008-09 season snapped the Fighting Scots' 24-match winning streak in EWL dual matches. However, the Fighting Scots still own a non-losing streak of 30 straight matches, with a 28-0-2 record during that period. Edinboro has not lost since a 21-14 loss to Bloomsburg in 2004-05, and had gone 6-0 each of the previous three years before finishing at 5-0-1 last year.

## ► Scots Register Furious Rallies vs. Buffalo, Clarion

Last weekend was one to remember for the Fighting Scots. They fell behind 17-3 to a Buffalo team that had never defeated the Fighting Scots in 13 previous matches, only to rora back to win the final five matches and prevail 19-17. Shawn Fendone upset Jimmy

Hamel at 197 lbs. to pull the Scots to within 17-16 and stave off elimination. Chris Birchler followed with a 9-3 win at heavyweight for the deciding points. The next Clarion won four of the first five bouts to jump to a 13-3 lead. Edinboro again came back to win the final five matches, including pins by Jarrod King at 165 lbs. and Fendone at 197 lbs.

## ► Horton Third at Shorty Hitchcock Memorial Classic

Redshirt freshman **Mike Horton** picked up a third place finish at Millersville's Shorty Hitchcock Memorial Classic on January 17. Horton went 3-1 while competing at heaby-weight, winning twice by fall.

## ► Seven Wrestlers Place as Boro Finishes Fourth at Southern Scuffle

**Chris Honeycutt** led a contingent of seven Edinboro wrestlers to place at the Southern Scuffle. Honeycutt took home first place at 184 lbs. thanks to a 7-5 upset of fifth-ranked Dustin Kilgore of kent State in the finals, propelling the Fighting scots to a fourth place finish out of 31 teams. Honeycutt is redshirting this year, but the Southern Scuffle scoring still counts red shirts in team scores. In addition to Honeycutt, **Torsten Gillespie** (149 lbs.), **Jarrold King** (165 lbs.) and **Chris Birchler** (285 lbs.) placed third. **eric morrill** brought home a fifth place finish, with **Ashton Osterberg** and **Phil Moricone** coming in eighth at 133 and 174 lbs., respectively. Edinboro ended the two-day tournament with 97.5 points. Cornell won the Southern Scuffle with 164 points, with Minnesota second (151.5) and Indiana third (131.5).

## ► Honeycutt Named EWL Wrestler of the Week

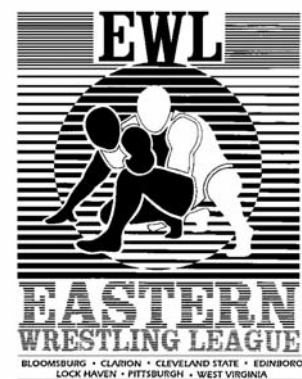

## ▶ King Reaches 100 Wins

Jarrold King won all five of his matches at the Reno Tournament to repeat as the 165 lb. champion. In the process the senior reached 100 career wins. He has an 93-15 record at Edinboro after going 22-11 at Oklahoma, giving him a career ledger of 115-26.

## ▶ Boro Finishes Second at Reno Tournament as Five Wrestlers Place

Edinboro finished second out of 25 teams while facing a very strong field in the Reno Tournament of Champions. Oklahoma State took home first place with 154 points, while the Fighting Scots finished with 85.5 points to edge Penn State (83 points). A pair of Fighting Scots – **Eric Morrill** (125 lbs.) and **Jarrold King** (165 lbs.) -- came away with individual championships, with a total of five Boro wrestlers placing. Making the showing even more impressive was that Edinboro did not have anyone competing at 141 lbs., and freshman John Greisheimer was competing as the starter at 157 lbs. for the first time and lost both of his matches. King repeated as the champion at 165 lbs., and in the process the sixth-year senior picked up his 100th career win, including his time at Oklahoma. That came in a 2-1 decision over eighth-ranked Dan Vallimont of Penn State in the finals. Morrill, ranked seventh and the number three seed, recorded four straight wins, three of those against seeded opponents. In the quarterfinals he won a 10-4 decision over Alan Bartelli of Boise State, the sixth seed and ranked 14th by Amateur Wrestling News and 15th by InterMat. That was followed by a 10-8 upset of Penn State's Brad Pataky, the second seed and ranked sixth, in the semifinals via a 10-8 decision. Pataky had defeated Morrill in the earlier dual match. He defeated Anthony Robles of Arizona State (#2 AWN, #3 IM) in the finals via a 4-3 decision. Three other Fighting Scots placed, led by an impressive showing by **Phil Moricone**. He came in unseeded after wrestling for the first time since November 2008 with a pair of matches the week before in the CSU Open. Since that time he had been out with a back injury, followed by a knee injury. Moricone went 5-1 to finish third. **Pat Bradshaw** brought home fifth place at 184 lbs. The fourth seed, the senior finished with a 5-2 record. **Torsten Gillespie** finished sixth at 149 lbs. for the second straight year winning three of five matches.

## ▶ Morrill Named PSAC Wrestler of the Week

Junior **Eric Morrill** was named the PSAC Wrestler of the Week for his performance in last Sunday's Ohio State dual. In a matchup of former national qualifiers, Morrill defeated Nikko Triggas, 6-4, to improve to 13-2.

## ▶ Boro Early-Signee Class Ranked Highly by InterMat

Head coach Tim Flynn recently announced the signing of four recruits for the 2010-11 season. Edinboro's recruiting class has been ranked 13th in Division I by InterMat. ## ► Cerminara Wins in Russia Dual

Edinboro assistant coach **Kyle Cerminara** recently participated in the USA/Russia Dual at Cornell College in Mt. Vernon, Iowa. Cerminara was one of three Team USA wrestlers to post victories, as Russia handed the United States a 4-3 defeat in the senior freestyle meet. Cerminara controlled Magomed Magomadov of Russia 3-1, 2-1 at 96 kg/211.5 lbs. "I just wanted to make the United States proud, along with myself and Edinboro," related the former University at Buffalo All-American afterwards. "I coach full-time at Edinboro, so its harder to train. I thank Tim Flynn for allowing me to take time off to do this." A large crowd was in attendance, and Cerminara was very appreciative. "Wrestling in Iowa, this is wrestling," he stated. "These fans understand wrestling. It was a great venue, and a really good experience." Earlier this year Cerminara finished fourth in the World Team Trials after placing second at

the 2009 U.S. Nationals at 96 kg.

## ► Nine Grapplers Place at Oklahoma Gold Showcase

Edinboro finished fourth of eight teams at the Brockport/Oklahoma Gold Showcase, finishing behind Oklahoma, Ohio State and Rutgers. **Jarrold King** and **Eric Morrill** brought home championships for the Fighting Scots at 165 and 125 lbs., respectively. King registered the biggest win of the day, as the defending national champion decided eighth-ranked Colt Sponseller of Ohio State in the finals, 8-5. **Chris Birchler** brought home second place at heavyweight, with **Joe Loffredo** (174) and **Pat Bradshaw** (184) taking third. **Torsten Gillespie** (149) and **Matt Laird** (157) were fifth, while **Kyle Fluke** (133) and **Joel Webster** (141) came in sixth.

## ► 15 Place at EMU Open

A total of 16 wrestlers placed at the 18th Annual EMU Open hosted by Eastern Michigan. Eight placed in the open division, with another seven doing the same in the freshmen-sophomore division. InterMat listed Minnesota's Dustin Schlatter, the national champion at 149 lbs. in 2006, as number one at 165 lbs. King was 32-5 a year ago.

## ► Honeycutt, Laird Pace Efforts at UB Open

**Chris Honeycutt** led a small contingent of Edinboro wrestlers in the UB Open on

November 1. The two-time national qualifier, who is redshirting this year, brought home first place at 184 lbs., finishing with a 5-0 record. Freshman **Matt Laird** made his debut at the UB Open and went 5-1 on the day to take home third place. All told, four Fighting Scots placed. **Mike Horton** placed fourth, and **Jon-Marc Burdick** came in sixth.

## ► Honeycutt to Redshirt

Two-time national qualifier **Chris Honeycutt** will redshirt in 2009-10. Honeycutt just missed earning All-American honors a year ago, but he will give way to Pat Bradshaw, who is moving down from 197 lbs., this year. Honeycutt has a 59-18 career record, including 33-8 a year ago.

## ► Birchler Glad to be With the Boro

When East Stroudsburg decided to make the move down to Division II, **Chris Birchler** wanted to continue competing on the Division I level. The senior transferred to Edinboro this summer and has high hopes of becoming Edinboro's first All-American at heavyweight since Dean Hall in 1988. Birchler fell just shy of that mark a year ago when he reached the round of 12 in the consolation bracket before suffering a 3-1 loss to fourth-seed Jared Rosholt of Oklahoma State, losing in sudden victory. Birchler's two losses at Nationals came in overtime, the other a 6-4 loss to top-seeded David Zabriskie of Iowa State in his first round match. Birchler finished the year with a 27-7 record after going 25-10 the year before. He transferred to ESU from Caktwell College after his freshman year.

## ► King, Moricone Granted Sixth Year by NCAA

Edinboro received a very welcome assist from the NCAA during the summer when it was announced that **Jarrold King** and **Phil Moricone** had been granted sixth years of eligibility. King returns as the national champion at 165 lbs. and was 32-5 last year. Moricone is a two-time national qualifier at 174 lbs. who missed all but the first weekend of competition last year due to an injury. He has a 59-26 career record.

## ► Bradshaw Drops Down to 184

A two-time national qualifier, **Pat Bradshaw** will move down to 184 lbs. this year. A year ago Bradshaw finished with a 26-9 record, winning the EWL and PSAC championships at 197 lbs.
